

## Big fourth quarter propels Old Mill

Patriots beat No. 14 Arundel; No. 5 Digital Harbor falls

Old Mill's Mike Holley scored 15 of his game-high 24 points in a 37-point fourth quarter for the Patriots, leading them to a come-from-behind 89-79 win over No. 14 and previously undefeated Arundel last night in Gambrills.

The Patriots, who also got 18 points from guard Eric Savage and 14 from guard Chris Day, rallied from a 13-point second-half deficit to improve to 11-1 overall and 6-0 in Anne Arundel County. The host Wildcats fell to 11-1 and 5-1 in league play.

Trailing 61-52 going into the fourth, the Patriots cranked up the defense and found their shooting range from behind the arc and at the foul line to win going away. Holley hit two three-pointers, Trae Summers (10 points) added one and Old Mill hit 16 of 17 free throws in the deciding quarter.

"We just came out hard [in the fourth quarter], played good defense and made our open shots - it's a big win," said Holley, a junior guard.

Senior forward Auraum Nuiriankh scored 17 points to lead the Wildcats.

**DUNBAR 73, No. 5 DIGITAL HARBOR 55:** The Poets (8-3) raced out to a seven-point halftime lead and never trailed after that in their upset of the visiting Rams (7-3).

Derell Edwards scored 14 of his game-high 20 points in the first half for Dunbar.
