

Old Mill takes care of South River in boys hoops

Strong shooting and fast-paced offense key in Patriots' 90-54 boys basketball rout

Junior guard Mike Holley had 16 points and seven assists while junior Chris Day had 21 points and six assists to lead the Old Mill High School boys basketball team over host South River, 90-54, on senior night Tuesday in Millersville.

The Patriots improve to 18-1 overall, 13-0 in the county. The win also clinches a county championship berth for Old Mill, which will appear in its third in four years. South River fell to 7-12, 5-9.

Old Mill's fast paced offense and quick scoring runs took care of the Seahawks. South River was led by senior guard Chris Dunn, who had 25 points and five rebounds and sophomore Derrick Sewer, who had 16 points, five rebounds, and one block.

Sophomore forward Eric Savage also paced the Patriots with 15 points and two blocks. Old Mill opened the game on a 13-4 run to start things off and ended the third on a 12-3 surge.

South River plays at home against Broadneck on Friday, while Old Mill visits Meade.
